



ADVICE FOR SUCCESSFUL APPLICATIONS

Each year talented students submit applications with numerous errors and are therefore not considered for the scholarship. Consider this advice and increase your chances for being awarded this valuable honor.

- Proofread grammar, spelling and punctuation. Consider having another person check it over, also.
- Written material should be no more than 200 words, but also not be too brief.
- The jury would prefer to see original work more than class assignments.
- Double check the school requirements. You must be attending full-time, be an art major, and attend an accredited school within Oregon, Washington and Idaho.
- Your weakest art piece can bring down the overall impression of you as an artist. Think about how you represent yourself if the weak piece was the only representation of your work.
- Which is your strongest image? Give us five equally as strong.
- Remember to discuss one of your images in the statement.
- 2D work only. No computer-generated art and no photoshopped images.
- Photograph your art carefully, with no parallax, no edges, no background, and no matting showing. Use good lighting. Crop the photo to its finished size.
- Copies of masterpieces or copies of copyrighted work decrease your points.
- Ask a teacher to curate your chosen images.
- Sign your work.
